

STAND DOWN 2025  
After-Action Report

May 16-17, 2025

**OVERVIEW**

STAND DOWN (SD) 2025 was a collaborative event led by the Tallahassee Veteran Organization (TVO) and various community social, health and human service organizations, which was held on May 16 - 17, 2025, at the Florida A&M University, Alfred B. Lawson Multi-Purpose Center, at 1800 Althea Gibson (Wahnish) Way, Tallahassee, FL 32310. Two hundred and seventy (270) Veterans received a multitude of services. Spouses, Gold Star Mothers and Caregivers were invited to attend. Thirty nine (39) agencies/organizations partners provided a full range of services with more than 1,400 interactions between the participating partners and Veterans. These services include financial guidance and support; housing; medical, mental health, dental and other health related needs, personal hygiene, and legal aid, etc.

**EVENT**

**Registration (Veterans/Vendors/Volunteers)**– Pre-Registration for Veterans wishing to attend SD 2025 was conducted online and most of those participating Veterans registered in-person. Volunteer registration was completed online using Bookwhen website. Pre-registered veteran applications were forwarded to VA Enrollment and Eligibility for pre-screening; assisting with expediting some of the participants registration although most registered in-person. **Transportation –Metro**, the City of Tallahassee provided fare free services to Veterans and their families to ride on regular fixed buses to and from the Stand Down at the Al Lawson Center..

**Medical** – Medical related services were provided by Neighborhood Medical Center, FSU School of Nursing, Keiser University School of Nursing , Palmer College of Chiropractic College and Magnolia Wellness Center. Neighborhood Medical Center committed their mobile unit to be on site for Friday, May 16, 2025.

**Dental** - Dental care/services were provided off- site at the First Baptist Church of Tallahassee, FL. The First Baptist Convention dental unit, staffed by volunteer dentists, dental assistants and hygienists partnered with volunteers from the First Baptist Church of Tallahassee to provide dental care/services to the residents of the Tallahassee community and graciously included serving our Veterans .

**Food** – All parties enjoyed the delicious meals prepared for the Veterans, vendors and volunteers. The culinary delights were very much appreciated at both breakfast and lunch meals that were served on both days. Meals were prepared by Fryson's Kitchen, Lindy's Fried Chicken and Sonny's Barbecue Restaurant and complimented by Krispy Kreme donuts, Wing Stop, Community Coffee

and Blue Bell Ice Cream. Food contracts were established with Sonny's Barbecue, Fryson Kitchen and Catering and Lindy's Chicken. Food related donations were made by Blue Bell Ice Cream, Sam's Club, Community Coffee, Wing Stop, Labor Ready.

**Services (Veterinary/Barber/Chiropractic Massages)** Veterinary services including annual shots, medications and preventative care were provided by Northwood Animal Hospital. Barber services were provided by Lively Barber School to 39 veterans. Palmer College of Chiropractic provided chiropractic evaluations and treatments including soft tissue and mechanical massages for 76 veterans.
